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Directions to State College:

All participants are urged to park in the Beaver Ave parking garage across the street from the church. (Use elevator/stairs at the south end directly across from the post office.) Handicapped access is available either from the main doors on the alley (by the Post Office and opposite the parking garage). Or from the Beaver Ave. metered parking lot side through the lower level doors at the front and the elevator to the sanctuary level. Only those requiring handicapped/disabled parking should park in the unmetered row of parking spaces next to the church on the east side. There is a charge for parking, but State College PC will provide registered participants vouchers good in the Beaver Ave. Parking garage for three hours free time.

From I-80: Take Exit #158 toward Milesburg. Follow PA #144 to Bellefonte (Water Street). Continue straight ahead on PA #150 to the State College Mall. Continue straight ahead on PA #26 to downtown State College. At the Atherton St. intersection, turn left onto Atherton. Turn left at the next light (Beaver Ave.) Go a block and a half, and turn right into parking garage.

From Philipsburg: Take US #322 east to State College. Take the business #322/North Atherton Street exit. The exit ramp becomes North Atherton Street. Take Atherton to the center of State College. One block beyond College Ave., turn left on Beaver Ave. Go a block and a half, and turn right (middle of the block) into parking garage

From east: Take US #322 west to State College. Take the #322 business exit through Boalsburg. #322 becomes South Atherton Street. Take Atherton to the center of State College. Turn right on Beaver Ave. Go a block and a half, and turn right (middle of the block) into parking garage

From southwest of presbytery: Take #45 east from Tyrone through Warrior's Mark to Seven Stars. [This is also #550 to Warrior's Mark, and #350 to Seven Stars.] Left on #45, to Pine Grove Mills. From the light in Pine Grove, follow #26, which is College Avenue. In State College, follow the jog (when #26 becomes one way) to Beaver Avenue. Follow Beaver Avenue across Atherton Street. Go a block and a half, and turn right into parking garage. Note: Many may find that taking I-99 to State College, while slightly more miles, is shorter in time and stress. If you take I-99, exit I-99 at business #322/N. Atherton Street and follow the Philipsburg directions.

From south of presbytery: Take #26 from Huntingdon to Pine Grove Mills. From the light in Pine Grove, follow #26, which is College Avenue. In State College, follow the jog (when #26 becomes one way) to Beaver Avenue. Follow Beaver Avenue across Atherton Street. Go a block and a half and turn right into parking garage.

CONSENT AGENDA

What is a consent agenda?

A consent agenda is made up of items that may be considered routine business that need action, but are unlikely to require debate. Items for inclusion on the consent agenda must be sent out in advance with the pre-presbytery mailing and clearly marked for the consent agenda.

Why is a consent agenda useful?

When the consent agenda is called for, the moderator will call for a motion to approve the entire consent agenda in one vote, thus saving presbytery time for items requiring more discussion.

BUT What if I wish to debate, discuss, ask for clarification on some part of the consent agenda?

Simply, rise to be recognized and request that that item be removed from the consent agenda. One person's request is all that is required. No second is required, no vote need be taken to remove the item.

Do not give the explanation of your concern, need for clarification, points to be emphasized or opposed at this time. The item will come up for consideration at the time when the remainder of that committee's report is made, and you will be afforded the opportunity to speak to the motion at that time.

Items for the January 26, 2019, Consent Agenda:

COM report: Item 1, p.14, Validatable ministries; Item 2, p. 14, Members-at-large; Item 3, p. 14, permission to labor within the bounds; Item 4, p. 14, permission to labor outside the bounds; Item 5, pp. 14-15, Juniata & Kephart renewal; Item 6, p. 16, adjustment in terms of call of General Presbyter.

ADMINISTRATION UMBRELLA TEAM REPORT January 26, 2019

For action:

The Administration Umbrella Team recommends that presbytery approve the following motions:

1. Juniata Capital Savings Account: that presbytery release from restricted use the amount above \$20,000 in the Juniata Presbyterian Church capital savings account. The result would require the session to maintain a \$20,000 reserve, which would continue to be restricted to capital need and/or the pastor's housing allowance but permit the session free use of all funds above the \$20,000 reserve.

Note: Juniata Presbyterian Church holds a capital savings account with approximately \$68,000 in it. This account began with about \$45-48,000 proceeds from the sale of its manse. In approving the sale of the manse, presbytery (*June 29, 1993 minutes, page 12*) required the proceeds to be held in an account restricted to use for capital needs and/or the pastor's housing allowance. Juniata session is now requesting permission to remove the restriction on the account and to draw down the account as it wishes for ministry and mission in general.

2. Christian Education Grant Fund: that presbytery define the Christian Education Grant Fund as follows. "The Christian Education Grant Fund is restricted. The purpose is to provide Christian Education programs to benefit the whole presbytery."

Note: the Christian Education Grant Fund was funded by a grant from the Synod of the Trinity prior to 1991 to enable the hiring of resource staff at the presbytery level. It has always been restricted monies, but no definition of the Grant Fund is given in our Special Funds Database. This would be a policy statement. Therefore, it requires a two-thirds majority for passage.

- 3. Amendments sent down by the 223rd General Assembly: that presbytery approve the following process for consideration of the proposed amendments sent down by the 223rd General Assembly:
 - a. That up to 20 minutes be allocated for debate on the amendments. That speakers be limited to two minutes per speech and to a total of 15 minutes per amendment.
 - b. That speakers alternate between pro and con; when all those wishing to speak are either all pro or all con, the moderator may declare that the presbytery is ready to move on to the next amendment.
 - c. That voting be done by secret ballot. The moderator will appoint tellers to distribute and count the ballots.

Recommendations: AUT recommends that presbytery take the following actions on the proposed amendments to the PCUSA Constitution:

- 18-A Yes On specifying the criteria and minimum size for congregation nominating committees. [G-2.0401]
- 18-B.1 No On clarifying congregational prohibition against employing a minister who renounced jurisdiction while in the midst of disciplinary proceedings and clarifying procedure of a minister who so renounced who wishes to be restored to office [G-2.0509]

- 18-B.2 No If a former minister who renounced jurisdiction while being accused in a disciplinary case rejoins the church, no time limit shall apply. [D-10.0401d]
- 18-C Yes On prohibiting endorsement of or opposition to individuals running for public office. [G-3.0104]
- 18-D Yes On requiring a minister to obtain permission to labor inside or outside presbytery geographic bounds annually. [G-3.0306]
- 18-E Yes On clarifying that presbyteries are to be pastors and counselors to all ministers of Word and Sacrament, commissioned pastors and certified Christian Educators. [G-3.0307]
- 18-F No On clarifying that baptized children who wish to receive Lord's Supper should be welcomed and provided instruction (but eliminates the hint of a "first communion" service). [W-4.0202]
- 18-G No On declaring that sexual abuse as defined in D-10-0401d is an offense contrary to the Scriptures and the Constitution of the PCUSA. [D-2.0203b]
- 18-H.1 Yes On clarifying that there is no time limit for charging that a person knew or should have known of the reasonable risk of sexual abuse or failed to take reasonable steps to minimize the risk. [D-10.0401]
- 18-H.2 Yes On clarifying that sexual abuse is defined as any offense involving sexual conduct in relation to anyone, regardless of age, without the capacity to consent. [D-10.0401c]

Rationale:

- 18-A Reasonable clarification
- 18-B.1 Prefer current language. Do not like the switch of responsibility from the individual to the congregation.
- 18- B.2 Prefer current language and prefer it be referred to ROD task force.
- 18-C So long as this amendment applies only to persons running for office and not issues, it makes sense.
- 18-D Being a connectional church, this makes for good oversight.
- 18-E This is reasonable cleanup
- 18-F Unnecessary and superfluous

- 18-G Unnecessary. Already covered. When a list is created, it implies items not on the list are excluded. Therefore don't start a list.
- 18-H.1 This is reasonable cleanup
- 18-H.2 This is reasonable cleanup and clarification.

The Committee on Ministry recommends that presbytery approve the following:

 Validated Ministries: that presbytery validate the following ministries for 2018: Anne Ard (validated ministry in service beyond the jurisdiction of the church) Dennis Braun (validated ministry in service beyond the jurisdiction of the church) Kathy Colebank (validated ministry in service beyond the jurisdiction of the church) Joy Kaufmann (General Presbyter)

[Presbytery shall review annually the work of all teaching elders engaged in validated ministries outside the congregation. G-2.0503a]

- 2. **Members at large:** that presbytery grant the following minister members of presbytery member at large status: Peggy Lindsey Tom Poole Christina Trimble [*Presbytery shall review annually the status of members-at-large. G-2.0503b*]
- 3. Annual review of laboring within the bounds: That presbytery authorize the following to labor within our bounds as Approved Pulpit Supply: Rev. Peggy Bonsell (United Methodist); Rev. James Bricker (ELCA); Mr. David Dimmick (United Methodist); Mr. Darwin Goshorn (United Methodist); Rev. Charles Gummo (United Methodist); Rev. Richard Henry (United Church of Christ); Rev. Mark Liller (Church of the Brethren); Mr. Joachin Anabel Lopez (PCUSA, candidate); Mr. Steve Rynkewitz (United Methodist lay pastor); Ms. Beverly Skopic (Church of the Brethren); Rev. Nathan Starr (Church of God); Rev. Charles Stump (Christian Missionary Alliance).
- **4. Labor outside the bounds**: That presbytery authorize the following to labor outside our ecclesiastical bounds: Al Holtzinger, Jr., as commissioned lay pastor of Grace United Church of Christ; and Ela J. Robertson as pastor of the St. John's Lutheran Church.

5. Juniata and ruling elder Janet Kephart:

- a. That presbytery approve the request of the session of the Altoona Juniata Presbyterian Church for a temporary supply relationship between ruling elder Janet Kephart and the session of the Altoona Juniata Presbyterian Church, beginning February 1, 2019 for up to twelve months.
- b. That presbytery grant a commission to ruling elder Janet Kephart to be commissioned ruling elder and commissioned lay pastor of the Juniata Church for a period of up to twelve months, beginning February 1, 2019. The commissioned lay pastor remains a member of the Osceola Mills Presbyterian Church.
- c. That presbytery authorize ruling elder Janet Kephart as the commissioned lay pastor of the Juniata Presbyterian Church to administer the Lord's Supper, administer the sacrament of baptism, moderate the session and congregation, and have voice and vote in meetings of presbytery (such vote to be counted as a ruling elder commissioner).
- d. That presbytery appoint ruling elder Janet Kephart as moderator of the Juniata Presbyterian

Church for the duration of her commission, beginning February 1, 2019.

- e. That presbytery authorize ruling elder Janet Kephart as commissioned lay pastor to perform a service of Christian marriage of members of her congregations or of the local community when invited by the session. Such service may only be performed within the geographical bounds of the presbytery. In performing such service of Christian marriage, the commissioned lay pastor shall follow all provisions of the Directory for Worship regarding marriage.
- Note: All background checks have been completed. A sexual conduct sign-off is on file. The commissioned lay pastor has submitted a statement of faith. The Rev. Rob Bruinooge remains the commissioned lay pastor's mentor.

Summary of terms of service. SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES OF PASTOR

- A. **Worship:** Lead worship on Sundays, plus special services including services on Christmas Eve and Maundy Thursday.
- B. **Visitation:** The commissioned ruling elder will, with the help of session, determine a visitation schedule of those that are shut-ins, hospitalized and nursing home residents. Visitation will be a joint effort of members and commissioned ruling elder.
- C. **Sacraments:** The commissioned ruling elder will officiate at baptisms and the Lord's Supper. The commissioned ruling elder will take communion, if requested, to the homebound, with an accompanying ruling elder.
- D. Weddings and funerals. The commissioned ruling elder is authorized to perform a service of Christian marriage of members of the congregation or of the local community when invited by the session. Such service may only be performed within the geographical bounds of the presbytery. In performing such service of Christian marriage, the commissioned ruling elder shall follow all provisions of the Directory for Worship regarding marriage. As pastor, the commissioned ruling elder has the privilege of first refusal of any wedding or funeral held at the church.
- E. Administration: To provide active leadership to the session and congregation as moderator.
- F. **Presbytery:** To attend presbytery meetings and presbytery-sponsored lay pastor training events.

Financial Terms of Service

- A. Cash salary: \$175 per week. \$485 per month to be considered housing. This is based on ten hours per week.
- B. Car allowance: Mileage at presbytery-approved rate, currently \$.58 per mile
- C. Continuing education: The commissioned ruling elder is encouraged to engage in continuing education.
- D. Vacation: One month vacation per year, calculated at half time, including at least four Sundays.

TERMINATION, SEVERANCE, AND EXTENSION OF CONTRACT

A. Any party to this agreement may terminate this contract upon thirty days written notice to the other. Notice is to be delivered in person or by certified mail.
