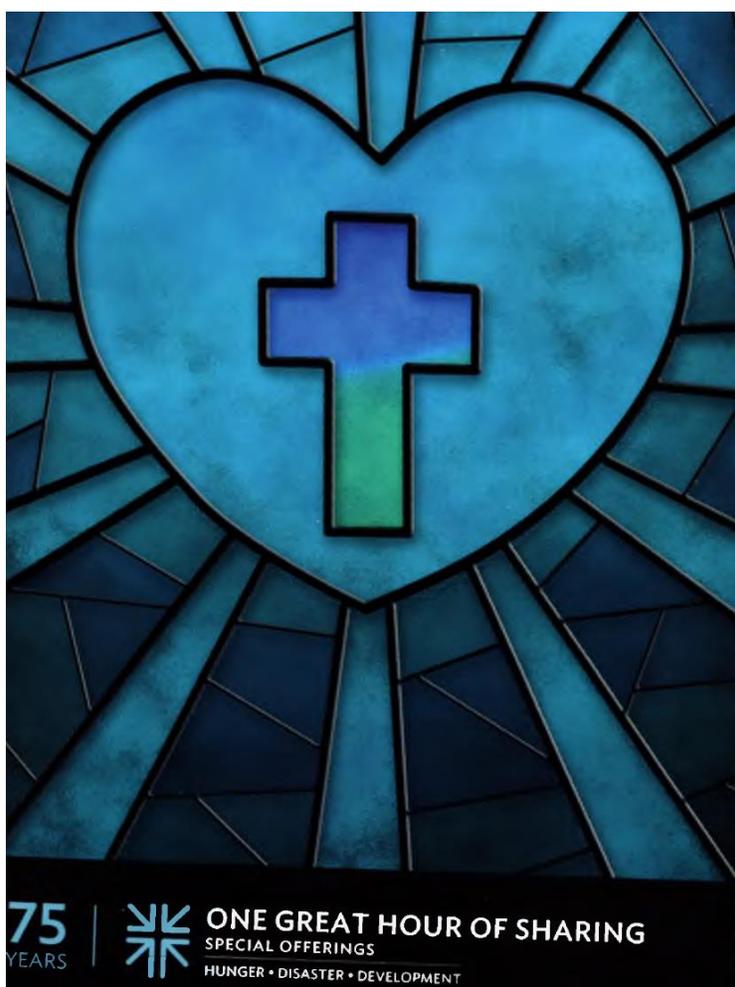

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DIRECTIONS TO FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH HOLLIDAYSBURG

From North: Take I-99 south to Altoona. In Altoona, take Exit #32, Frankstown Road. Turn left onto Frankstown Road. Go 0.3 miles. Bear left on East Plank Road (U.S. #220). Bear left again onto Logan Blvd (PA #36 South). Go 3.5 miles to Hollidaysburg. In Hollidaysburg, turn left on Walnut Street to the church.

From East: Take U.S. #22 west from Huntingdon about 27 miles to the center of Hollidaysburg. Turn right onto Penn Street (PA #36 North). Go about three blocks to Walnut ST. Turn right at church.

PARKING: Parking is on the street. There are a few handicapped parking spaces in the alley behind the church.

Boundaries Training

Boundaries training is required for clergy and CLP's every three years. This training is in addition to training on the mandated reporting of child abuse which is a separate training also required. However, the training is helpful for anyone in a leadership position in the local church.

Developing and maintaining appropriate professional and personal boundaries is important in all aspects of the life of the church. In this training, we will cover the basics of boundaries – what they are, why they are important, and the damage that can be caused when they are violated. Here are some things every spiritual leader needs to know about boundaries:

- They help us maintain clear professional relationships
- They are guidelines (usually unwritten) that help us know when and when not to participate in a given activity, especially if we have more power
- They are not intended to shackle us but to free us in our work as spiritual leaders

- They help us keep perspective when people's problems seem overwhelming
- They signal to others that it is safe to trust us
- They protect congregants from our intentional or unintentional abuse of power

Using tools developed by the FaithTrust Institute, a long-time leader in the field of addressing and working to prevent clergy misconduct, we will hear from other spiritual leaders and teachers, reflect together on who we are called to be as leaders in this Presbytery, and recommit ourselves to our work and calling.

Topics included in the training include:

- What are boundaries? How do they work? Why do we need them?
- Power and authority
- Maintaining appropriate boundaries in congregations
 - Friendships
 - Dating relationships
 - Counseling and pastoral care
 - Social Media challenges
 - Financial issues
 - Preventing boundary crossing and self-care

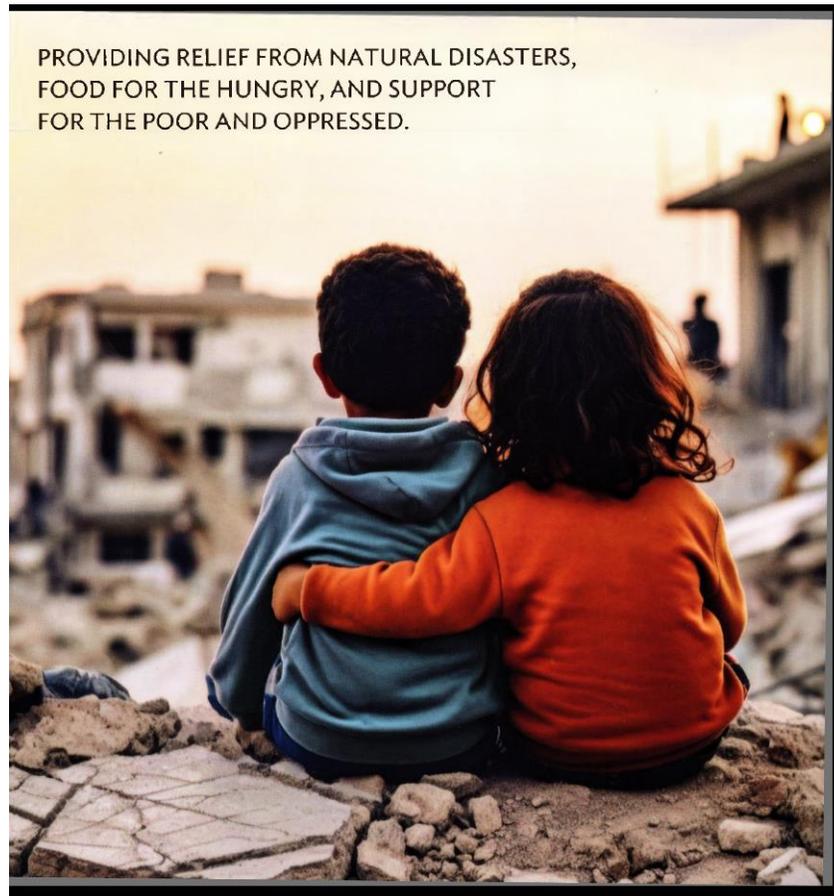

NOTES TO 2024 ACTUAL CALLS AND CONTRACTS

Alexandria & Logan Valley: This is a student intern service in covenant relationship contract. It is for 87.5% time. 50% time to Alexandria and 37.5% time to Logan Valley. The costs are split according to the time allocation: 50% to Alexandria; 37.5% to Logan Valley. The intern remains a student under care of this presbytery and will be participating in Pittsburgh T.S.'s field experience program. The intern receives support from a Gloria Jean Smith Scholarship grant.

Bedford: Matching 403b. Medical FSA. Cell phone allowance, vouchered. Up to \$9000.

Belleville West Kish: This is a temporary supply contract shared equally between Belleville West Kish and Reedsville East Kish. Each congregation pays for and receives half-time services. Equivalent to the Board of Pensions dues for pension, there is a 403b, which is through the Board of Pensions.

Blairs Mills Upper Tuscarora: This is a half time contract. Pastor will preach 28 Sundays per year. No pension dues because pastor is a temporary supply retiree.

Clearfield: This is a slightly less than half time contract. Since Temporary Supply pastor is a retiree, there are no Board of Pension dues.

Houtzdale: Houtzdale pays the travel expense for sharing a Commissioned Ruling Elder with Osceola Mills.

Lewistown: Major Medical deductible/HAS. Deferred compensation.

Little Valley: Pastor to preach 46 Sundays per year. 15 hours per month for pastoral care. Board of Pensions dues paid by Carlisle call. Pastor remains a member of Carlisle Presbytery.

Mountain Top Larger Parish: Cash salary: On the Sundays when the part time CLP is serving as worship leader and when special worship services are scheduled salary payment will be \$345 per week. On weeks the CLP is not leading worship services the salary payment will be \$270 per week. Continuing education: The commissioned ruling elder is encouraged to engage in continuing education. Participation in events beyond one-day workshops should be determined in advance in consultation with the Council. Reimbursement of costs associated with continuing education should be negotiated in advance with Council.

State College: SCPC to be responsible to pay pension dues of 21% Total Effective Salary for Rev. Maus, under a Pathways to Renewal agreement approved by Board of Pensions. Supplemental dental insurance provided to Rev. Maus. This is a designated term pastorate, which will close on June 30, 2024.

State College: There is sabbatical leave of three months after six years. There is the option of equity sharing on the pastor's house. If done, to be recorded at the courthouse.

Tyrone First: \$1,000 for Annual Conference expenses and approximately \$8400 reimbursement of dependent health insurance costs via spouse's plan, since

pastor is not PCUSA. The Temporary Supply Pastor participates in the Board of Pensions Benefits Plan for Retirement, Life Insurance, and Death & Disability Insurance, premiums calculated for a two-thirds time call. The Temporary Supply Pastor will be granted two additional Sundays off in addition to vacation and continuing education weeks.

Tyrone Sinking Valley: Temporary Supply pastor has entirely separate lease of the manse. It is not part of the terms of service. Because the pastor is a retiree, there are no pension dues.

Upper Spruce Creek: CRE will preach 34 Sundays per year

Commissioned Ruling Elders: Presbytery policy does not require certified lay preachers under contract nor commissioned ruling elders to be enrolled in the Board of Pensions. LaMarr Adamson, Bill Conway, Gary Jewart, Scott Kretchmar, Leanne Peters, and Kate Sillman are commissioned ruling elders and are not enrolled in the Board of Pensions.

STATED CLERK REPORT
April 9, 2024

The stated clerk requests that presbytery approve the following motions:

1. Manual Amendment, section 12: Permanent Judicial Commission: The section of the Book of Order dealing with the Rules of Discipline has been replaced by a section entitled "Church Discipline. In order to bring our Manual into conformity with the new Church Discipline, the stated clerk requests that presbytery make the following changes to section 12 of our Manual. Text to be removed is struck through; text to be added is in italics.

Changes to the Manual require two readings and the approval of two-thirds of the members present and voting. This is the second reading; final vote will come at this meeting.

M-12.00 PERMANENT JUDICIAL COMMISSION

M-12.01 Purpose: The presbytery shall elect a Permanent Judicial Commission in accordance with the provisions of ~~the Rules of Discipline.~~ *Church Discipline.* The Permanent Judicial Commission conducts hearings and trials concerning remedial and discipline cases within the presbytery.

M-12.02 Membership: Members are elected by the presbytery *every two years* to fill six-year terms *so as to have eight members at any given time when at full strength.* A member may not be re-elected to another term until ~~four~~ *two* years have elapsed. *Additional members may be elected at other times to fill unexpired terms as needed.*

M-12.03 Officers: The Permanent Judicial Commission shall elect from its members a moderator, ~~and~~ *a vice moderator and assistant clerk at its first meeting.* *The vice moderator and assistant clerk shall be empowered to act as moderator or clerk of the Permanent Judicial Commission, respectively, as needed in the incapacity of the moderator or clerk of the Permanent Judicial Commission.*

M-12.04 Meetings: The Permanent Judicial Commission shall meet at such times and places as the commission shall determine.

M-12.05 Duties: The duties of the Permanent Judicial Commission shall be those responsibilities assigned to it by ~~the Rules of Discipline.~~ *Church Discipline,* and its activities will be guided by the ~~Rules of Discipline.~~ *Church Discipline.*

- M-12.06** ***Committee of Counsel:*** *When the presbytery becomes either a complainant or a respondent, the stated clerk, moderator of presbytery, and the General Presbyter shall appoint no more than three persons to be a committee of counsel. This committee shall represent that complainant or respondent in the case until final decision is reached in the highest council to which the case is appealed. All members of a committee of counsel shall be members of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) The stated clerk, the General Presbyter and any other employees of the presbytery shall not serve on a committee of counsel of the presbytery.*
- M-12.07** ***Investigating Committee:*** *When the stated clerk receives an allegation of an alleged offense, the stated clerk shall inform the moderator of presbytery and the General Presbyter. They shall proceed to appoint an investigating committee. If any of these are the subject of the investigation, the Chairperson of the Committee on Ministry or other members of the Committee on Ministry may be asked to replace the one/those accused for the purpose of forming the investigating committee. They shall appoint an investigating committee composed of no more than five but no fewer than three members, all of whom shall be members of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) The investigating committee shall conduct an inquiry following the rules of Church Discipline.*
- M-12.08** ***Special Review Committee:*** *The moderator of the Permanent Judicial Commission shall designate a special review committee to review any petition for review of the procedures of the investigating committee while the investigation in a disciplinary case is in process to review any petition for review of the decision not to file charges, and to determine the need for administrative leave. The special committee shall be composed of at least one current member of the Permanent Judicial Commission, and may include up to two former members of the Permanent Judicial Commission. The members of this committee shall not participate in any part of any subsequent trial.*

1. **Annual report of Loans Outstanding**, as of January 31, 2024
Krislund Camp & Conference Center: New Church Planting Loan. Krislund borrowed \$81,500 from the Presbytery of Huntingdon New Church Planting Funds. This loan was approved by the September 25, 2007 presbytery meeting. The remaining balance is \$12,764.53

East Kish: East Kish Presbyterian Church borrowed \$40,000 at 3.75% in April of 2020 for 120 months from the Revolving Loan Fund. The remaining balance is \$29,504.72.

Mount Union: Mount Union Presbyterian Church borrowed \$55,000 in November of 2022 for 120 months from the Revolving Loan Fund at 1.75%. The remaining balance is \$49,495.49.

There are no reports of indebtedness to other lenders.

2. **Mapleton property transfer:** Mapleton property, tax parcel 26-02-98, was sold to the borough of Mapleton on May 5, 2023, for one dollar. This is the same property recorded February 9, 1888, in Huntingdon County Deed Book, T-3 p. 502.
3. **Boundary Training:** The Book of Order, in order to increase protection of children, youth, and vulnerable adults, indeed to increase appropriate treatment of all children of God, now requires Boundary Training every thirty-six months. Presbyters requested that a training be held on a Saturday. Anne Ard has graciously agreed to lead a training by ZOOM only on Saturday April 20, 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The training is open to all, presbyters and church officers, but registration is required in order to be credited. Pre-register through CONNECTIONS or call the presbytery office number, 814-682-7289. Zoom codes will be sent to those who pre-register.
4. **Permanent Judicial Commission training.** The stated clerk, PJC members Beth Farmer, Jim Crawford, and Bob Peters, and Synod PJC member Brett Hoover took Permanent Judicial Commission training given by Flor Velez-Diaz, Manager of Judicial Process and Social Witness, and sponsored by the Synod of the Trinity, on March 19. Gratitude is expressed to the Bedford Presbyterian Church for hosting the event.
