Second Scripture Lesson: Romans 8: 26-39

²⁶ In the same way the Spirit also comes to help us, weak as we are. For we do not know how we ought to pray; the Spirit himself pleads with God for us in groans that words cannot express. ²⁷ And God, who sees into our hearts, knows what the thought of the Spirit is; because the Spirit pleads with God on behalf of his people and in accordance with his will.

²⁸ We know that in all things God works for good with those who love him, those whom he has called according to his purpose. ²⁹ Those whom God had already chosen he also set apart to become like his Son, so that the Son would be the first among many believers. ³⁰ And so those whom God set apart, he called; and those he called, he put right with himself, and he shared his glory with them

³¹ In view of all this, what can we say? If God is for us, who can be against us? ³² Certainly not God, who did not even keep back his own Son, but offered him for us all! He gave us his Son—will he not also freely give us all things? ³³ Who will accuse God's chosen people? God himself declares them not guilty! ³⁴ Who, then, will condemn them? Not Christ Jesus, who died, or rather, who was raised to life and is at the right side of God, pleading with him for us! ³⁵ Who, then, can separate us from the love of Christ? Can trouble do it, or hardship or persecution or hunger or poverty or danger or death? ³⁶ As the scripture says,

"For your sake we are in danger of death at all times; we are treated like sheep that are going to be slaughtered."

³⁷ No, in all these things we have complete victory through him who loved us! ³⁸ For I am certain that nothing can separate us from his love: neither death nor life, neither angels nor other heavenly rulers or powers, neither the present nor the future, ³⁹ neither the world above nor the world below—there is nothing in all creation that will ever be able to separate us from the love of God which is ours through Christ Jesus our Lord

L: This is the Word of the Lord.

P: Thanks be to God.

The Message: "Hear the Good News"

So let me ask a questions: Have you heard any good news lately. If you watch the news at any time on any news outlet, it all seems bad. They say bad news, sensational news sells. Well someone is getting rich off the news that is out there today for sure.

As we all know 2020 was a very difficult year for most people. There were wildfires, violent storms, protests and riots across the country, and of course Covid 19.

And on and on they go, each day more and more dire headlines. If you are like me, I just stop reading, watching and listening after awhile. It has been proven that a steady diet of bad news is harmful to your health. Depression, anxiety, fear, all these can be a result of all this bad news.

So where do we find Good News? Is there any good news to be heard in these times? These are certainly the times that try our souls to their very core.

In the scripture from Romans, we see nothing but good news.

Verse 26 starts with these words "In the same way the spirit also comes to us, weak as we are.

In the same way as what?? Well we must look at a couple of previous verses in this chapter to understand this.

Paul speaks of creation groaning in pain, because of the sin of man. He says that we who have the spirit also groan and long for the day we will be set free from this world with all its sin and pain.

So the spirit comes to help us in this. God intervenes in this scene with HOPE!! He intervenes because we are weak.

I want to break this portion of scripture down into all the promises that are made in these verses. All the GOOD NEWS

Good news No. 1 - The spirit prays for us.

He not only prays for us he prays in (groans) that words cannot express. The spirit pleads with God on our behalf and in accordance with God's will.

Jesus and the Father are one, our savior has a special way of speaking to the father on our behalf that we ourselves cannot even express. But always in accordance with God's will.

Many times I have found this to be so comforting. Don't we all have times when we are in such pain, such dismay that we really cannot express it in words It might be a death, sickness, loss of a job, financial problems, or just the pressures of everyday life. We want to pray and take these cares to the father, but we do not have words.

This is when the Spirit takes over. We just have to sit quietly and meditate and because God sees our hearts, he knows what we need even if we don't. He knows us far better than we know ourselves.

This is good new indeed.

Good news No. 2 - God works all things for good for us

All is a big word here. Can he really bring good out of everything that happens to us?

Yes, even when we feel helpless and are concerned about the future, we can be sure that our Father is working in us and for us to bring good from whatever is happening.

Lets look at Covid 19 – is there anything good to be learned here? Well life has slowed down a bit. How many times do we feel like we are on a fast train heading who knows where – the world is just moving too fast. Time is moving too fast. Covid 19 has slowed things down, we are staying home more, cooking and eating meals as families, parents are getting involved in their children's education, children have more of their parent's time

Is this God? I think so because if it is good, it is GOD. All good things come from the Father.

Good news No. 3 - God knows us personally and he loves us.

We were created in the image of his Son, Jesus Christ. Because of that, God knows us intimately. He calls us by name. He justifies us.

Justified: The dictionary says this means having been made righteous in the sight of God. Being defendable and legitimate.

Mankind is sinful, we know that. But He makes us whole, we are broken by sin, but he makes us whole. Sometimes even we think we are hard to love, but he loves us and makes us whole.

And if he justifies us, he also glorifies us. Why would a Holy, Sovereign God glorify you and me? For no other reason than he loves us. THAT IS CERTAINLY GOOD NEWS

Good news No. 4 – God is on our side

If God is for us, who can be against us. In other words, If God is for us, why do we care who is against us.

Nothing matters but our relationship with God. If he comes first all else will be added. And if he loves us, calls us by name, prays for us, justifies us and glorifies us, who or what can bring us harm. No one and nothing.

We belong to him. Sometimes circumstances make us feel inadequate, stupid, helpless. But God is on our side in all things. Remember that you are saved by grace and nothing you or I do can earn that grace nor can we lose our salvation. We are pitiful at times, but God is on our side.

Hebrews 13: 6 and 86 So we say with confidence, "*The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?*"

8 Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

This is good news.

Good news No. 5 – Jesus Christ intercedes for us He intercedes for us with the Father. He defends us and we need that. Sometimes we get so far off the mark, that only Jesus can explain our actions to the Father.

Think about what he said while on the cross. "Father forgive them for they know not what they do."

We live in a pressure cooker of a society. There is a lot of pressure to be this or that, to be politically correct, to be all things to all people.

This is when Jesus intercedes for us with the Father. He knows what is happening in the world and how it affects us. He knows that we are weak and in need of help. He explains who we are to the Father. That is indeed good news.

Good news No. 6 – Nothing can separate us from the Love of God.

I think these verses are some of the most beautiful words in scripture.

What can separate us from our loving father?

Can trouble, hardship, persecution, hunger, danger or even death? The first word in verse 37 answers this **NO** in all these things we have complete victory through him who loves us.

Paul says that he is certain that nothing in all creation, not death or life, angels or other heavenly rulers, neither the present or the future, neither the world above nor the world below. NOTHING can separate us from the love of God who sent his son to die for us.

If he would send his son for our salvation, why would he hold back anything else. We can be sure that he won't.

Good news **#7** we are redeemed!!

We have been bought by the shed blood of Jesus. We owe our very existence to him. He created us, loved us and saved us.

A story printed in the Moody press in 1990 said this:

A gathering of friends at an English estate nearly turned to tragedy when one of the children strayed into deep water. The gardener heard the cries for help, plunged in, and rescued the drowning child. That youngster's name was Winston Churchill. His grateful parents asked the gardener what they could do to reward him. He hesitated, then said, "I wish my son could go to college someday and become a doctor." "We'll see to it," Churchill's parents promised.

Years later, while Sir Winston was prime minister of England, he was stricken with pneumonia. The country's best physician was summoned. His name was Dr. Alexander Fleming, the man who discovered and developed penicillin. He was also the son of that gardener who had saved young Winston from drowning. Later Churchill remarked, "Rarely has one man owed his life twice to the same person."

This is the ultimate good news. Christ Jesus entered the world to rescue sinners. We are redeemed. We owe our lives to him twice; through creation and salvation.

Hallelujah Praise God.

So this is where the good news is. When all the bad news gets to be too much, open your Bible, turn to the Gospels, read the words of Jesus, turn to the writings of Paul and see what he says about our relationship with the Father. You will feel comforted, safe, and loved beyond your imagination.

What is our response for all of this. In psalm 105 which we read this morning it says:

Give thanks to the Lord, make known among the nations what he has done. Look to the Lord and his strength, seek his face always. Let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice. To God be the glory, Amen.
